PATIENTS, COLLEAGUES AND FRIENDS,

In 2025, we experienced a year of growth, collaboration and meaningful impact. With over 600 resilient and passionate healthcare professionals, we served more than 56,500 patients and completed over **219,700 visits** across our communities. These numbers represent more than statistics; they tell the story of lives touched, health improved and hope renewed.

Among our many achievements this year:

- **Expanded Access:** We celebrated the expansion of our **Mishawaka clinic**, increasing capacity and services to better meet patient needs and opened a **new clinic in Newton County**, extending care to an area in real need of health services.
- **Invested in Leadership:** Through HealthLinc University, we strengthened our leadership pipeline by offering four 0.5-level training programs (**90 graduates**) and three 1.0-level training programs (**37 graduates**).
- **Promoted Internal Talent:** **109** people were promoted internally, demonstrating that we are not only scaling education, but also reflecting that growth through career advancement and pay increases.
- **Practiced Financial Responsibility:** Through **fundraising and community partnerships**, we submitted **34 grant applications** and secured nearly **\$900,000** in new funding to support programs that help our patients thrive.
- **Developed Partnerships with Purpose:** Our collaboration with **Opportunity Enterprises** will bring essential health care to the community, including individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, a partnership that truly exemplifies our values.
- **Strengthened Community Connection:** During **National Health Center Week**, we hosted **six health fairs**, reaching **1,600 community members**, distributing **674 backpacks** filled with school and health supplies and completing over **1,300 well-child checks and sports physicals**.
- **Elevated Our Teams:** Through our **residency and training programs**, we actively addressed provider shortages by preparing clinicians to serve, and stay in, underserved communities.
- **Exceeded Standards:** During our **HRSA site visit**, reviewers affirmed what we already know - that HealthLinc consistently meets and exceeds the highest standards of care.

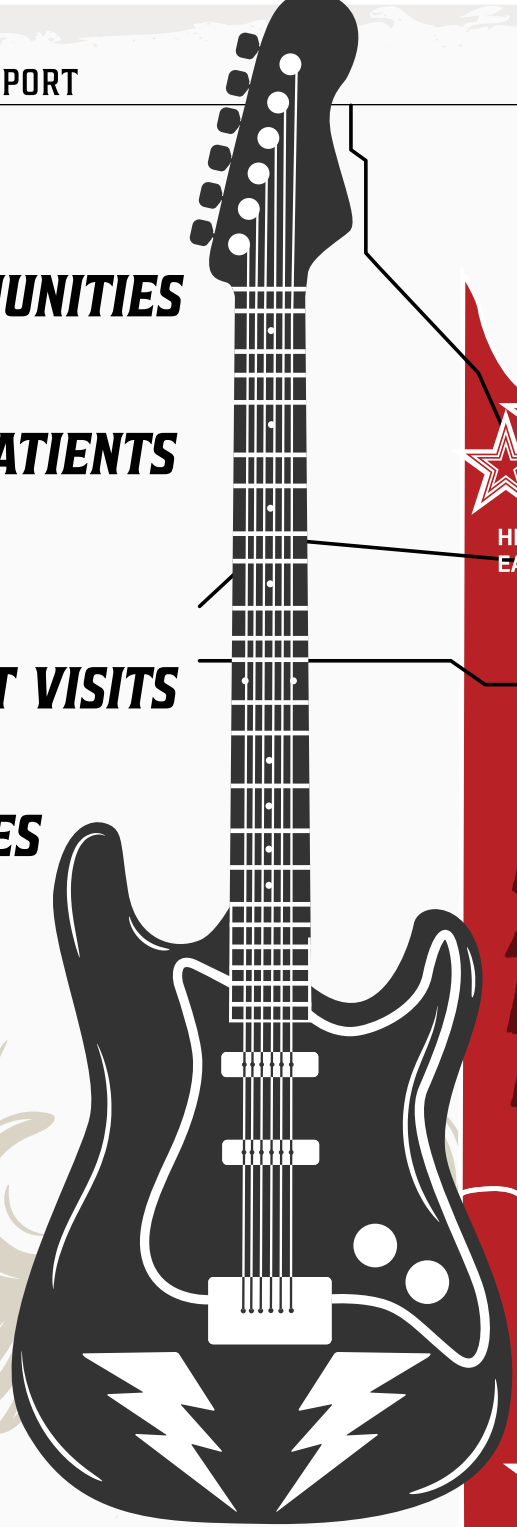

GROWING OUR LINEUP OF CLINICS AND SERVICES

HealthLinc saw a year of growth and expansion in 2025. From clinic remodels and bringing care to new counties, to partnership announcements and collaborations, we're growing our lineup to assist even more individuals in even more communities.

Newton County

Newton County is designated by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) as a rural area with a health professional shortage. On December 15, HealthLinc Newton opened inside of the Morocco Senior Nutrition & Activity Center in Morocco, IN. This new clinic allows us to provide affordable, personalized, patient-centered care for all that is close to home.

Mishawaka Expansion

HealthLinc Mishawaka underwent extensive renovations to ensure we can meet the demand for quality, affordable health care in St. Joseph County. The remodel added an additional 11,134 square feet of clinic space and includes 10 OB rooms, four behavioral health rooms, six chiropractic rooms and three optometry rooms.

Opportunity Enterprises (OE)

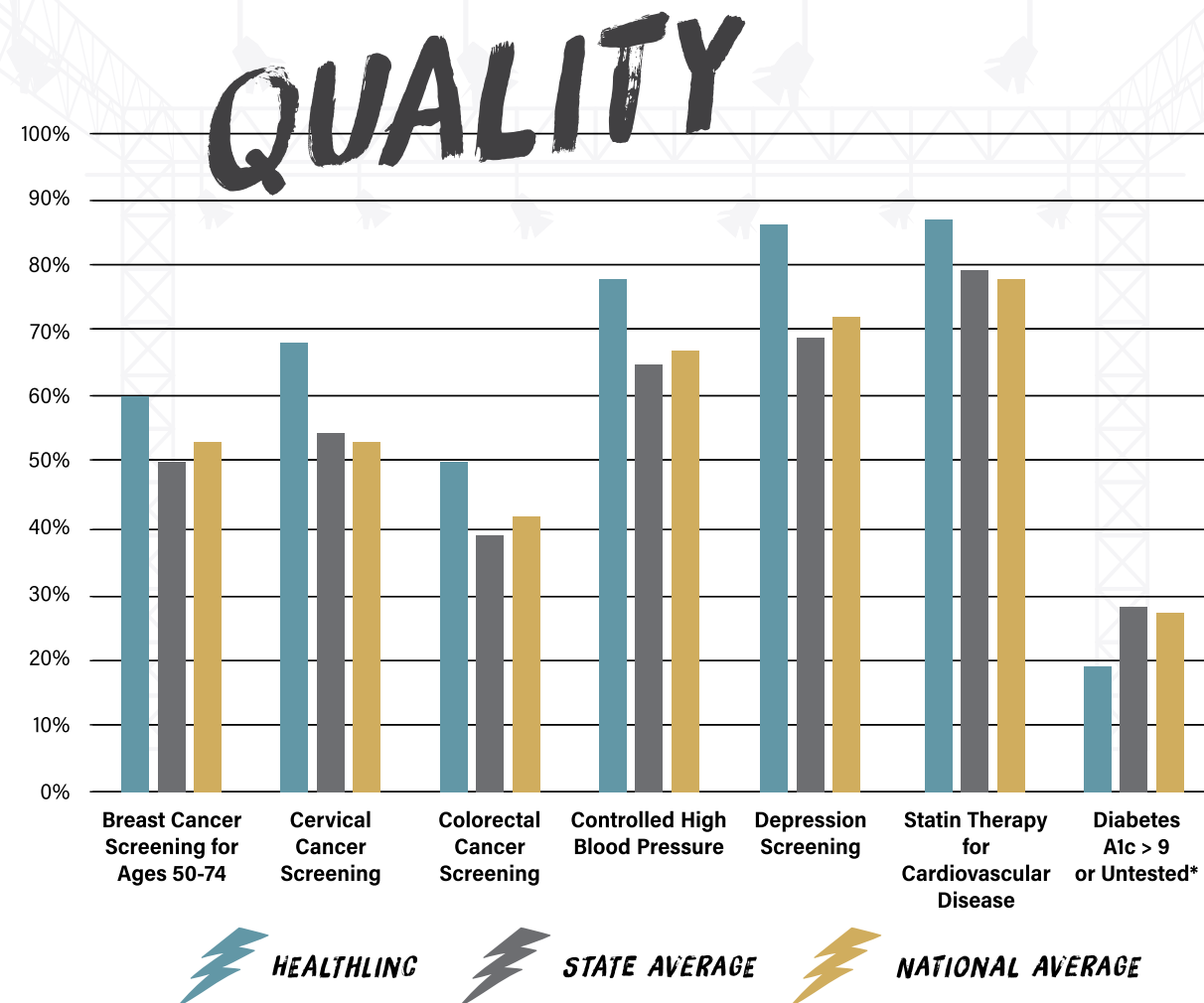
We announced that HealthLinc, in collaboration with Opportunity Enterprises, will be opening a new 7,500 square-foot clinic at OE's Valparaiso campus in 2026. This clinic will be open to the public and will prioritize the needs of individuals with intellectual/developmental and physical disabilities.

Ivy Tech

HealthLinc has a strong commitment to growing the talent of healthcare professionals in northern Indiana. As part of this commitment, HealthLinc partnered with Ivy Tech Community College, turning the top floor of HealthLinc Michigan City into a learning facility for students.

HIGH NOTES IN HEALTH CARE

As a Health Center Quality Leader, HealthLinc remains at the forefront of care in Indiana and the nation. Each year, we exceed quality goals in areas such as cholesterol, blood pressure and type 2 diabetes management, cancer screenings, depression management and more. HealthLinc continues to see year-over-year growth in the number of positive health outcomes, all thanks to the dedication of our staff to getting our patients screened and on the road to good health.

HEADLINERS OF DENTAL HEALTH

A healthy smile is more than just a confidence booster; **it's essential for overall health.** HealthLinc's dental team provides affordable, high-quality dental care for patients of all ages, focusing on prevention, early intervention and long-term oral health.

From routine cleanings and exams to fillings, extractions and comprehensive treatment planning, our providers help patients prevent problems before they start and address concerns when they arise.

In 2025, HealthLinc completed more than **22,900** dental visits at our clinics in East Chicago, La Porte, Michigan City, South Bend and Valparaiso, supporting brighter smiles and healthier lives across our communities.

Dental professionals play a critical role in preventing HPV-related cancers, especially cancers of the mouth and throat. At HealthLinc, we make prevention easier by offering HPV vaccines during routine dental visits in collaboration with our medical department, transforming an often overlooked opportunity into accessible care. By combining education and vaccination in the same appointment, we remove barriers for patients. In 2025, we administered **107 HPV vaccines to 103 patients.**

A FRONT ROW FOCUS ON VISION

HealthLinc helps keep life in focus by providing comprehensive eye care for our communities. From complete eye exams to advanced ocular health evaluations for chronic conditions, such as diabetes, cataracts, glaucoma and so much more, our optometry team works in partnership with patients and their medical providers to protect and preserve their vision. Our personalized approach supports not only sight, but the patient's overall health and quality of life.

Optometry services are available at HealthLinc East Chicago Harbor, Michigan City, Mishawaka and Valparaiso. In 2025, HealthLinc saw **over 4,650 optometry patients, completing 6,909 vision visits.**

TUNING IN TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

At HealthLinc, we know mental health is just as important as physical well-being. That's why our behavioral health therapists (BHTs), psychiatric providers and primary care teams work together to deliver the support patients need, when they need it.

Our behavioral health team helps patients manage conditions like depression, anxiety, trauma, substance abuse and more. We also support those experiencing the emotional impact of physical health conditions such as diabetes. Through regular appointments and follow-up care, we identify needs earlier and help patients stay on track with their health goals.

HealthLinc's whole-person approach to care makes it easier for patients to get behavioral health services in a safe, judgement-free space as part of their regular medical care. Whether it's a child struggling with anxiety or an adult facing daily stress, our team is here to listen, support and heal.

Recovery Rockstars

HealthLinc's Mobile Integrated Response Team (MIRT) works with our medical providers and BHTs to set goals, create recovery plans and advocate for individuals struggling with substance use. Our team of peer recovery coaches has lived experience with addiction and helps individuals in early recovery rediscover how to have fun in healthy, substance-free ways while building a self-directed life. Our coaches also partner with community resources, including recovery housing, treatment organizations and recovery support groups, across Lake, LaPorte, Newton, Porter, St. Joseph and Starke counties to create a safe and supportive environment for successful addiction recovery.

"I have a wonderful young patient that I have been working with for nearly a year. They came to the behavioral health team through a warm hand off from their primary care provider due to behaviors consistent with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) which were impacting them negatively in multiple life domains such as educational and general home life. ON STAGE WITH OUTREACH



Outreach serves as a vital connection between our clinics and the communities we serve. The team hosts and attends several community events each month, with our most popular being **Give Kids a Smile** in February, **community health fairs** in July and August and **Holidays with HealthLinc** in November and December. These events create welcoming opportunities for patients, families and community members to engage with HealthLinc, access resources and build lasting relationships with our care teams.

In 2025, outreach welcomed **28,172** individuals to over **450** events and outreach initiatives throughout our communities. Throughout the year, we hosted:

- 37 healthy cooking classes
- 144 pediatric patients screened during Give Kids a Smile
- 6 community resource fairs
- 7 Holidays with HealthLinc events + virtual calls with Santa
- 48 offsite insurance enrollment and education presentations
- 10 TotLinc playgroups at HealthLinc La Porte – *in partnership with Dunebrook*
- 14 pizza and paint parties
- + so much more!

The team also plays a critical role in many of our patients' lives by providing health insurance enrollment assistance. Enrollment team members work one-on-one with individuals to help them understand their coverage options and navigate the enrollment process for Medicare, Medicaid and Marketplace. With their help, **24,930** individuals were assisted, with **1,955** applications completed by HealthLinc in 2025.

“After spending nearly a year helping a patient regain their Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) program coverage, I stayed closely involved in their annual redetermination to ensure they wouldn't lose benefits again.

Although the patient completed and mailed their renewal paperwork on time, a postal error delayed delivery, triggering me to get notice that their coverage would end in February. I acted immediately, contacting the state with the patient on a three-way call to resolve the issue. The agency confirmed all required documents were received and expedited the case.

I'm happy to share that the patient's coverage remained active, preventing a lapse in benefits and protecting their access to care.”

THE PHARMACY BEAT

HealthLinc Pharmacy plays a vital role in helping patients manage their health. By offering affordable prescriptions, education and personalized support, our pharmacy team helps patients stick to treatment plans and avoid costly hospital visits. In 2025, HealthLinc Pharmacy filled over **180,000 prescriptions** and assisted **16,618 patients** in getting the medication they need. With support from the 340B Drug Pricing Program, HealthLinc reinvested financial resources into patient care services that directly benefit our communities. Savings from the program also allow us to offer low-cost prescription options for patients who need financial assistance.

By keeping medications affordable, accessible and understandable, HealthLinc Pharmacy helps our communities live healthier, more stable lives.

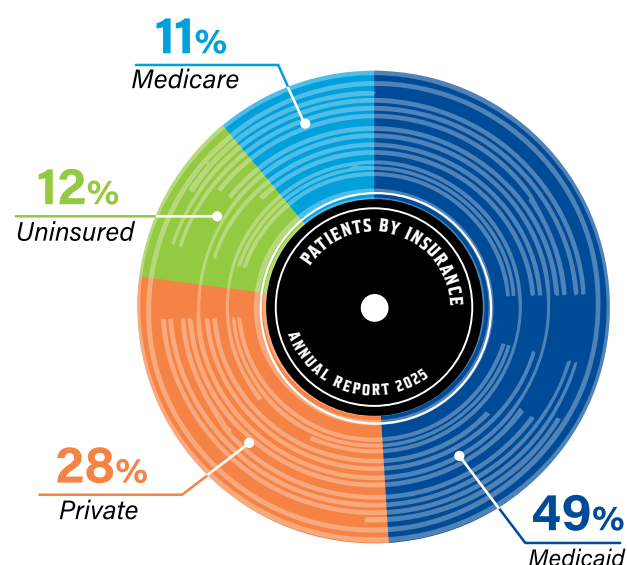

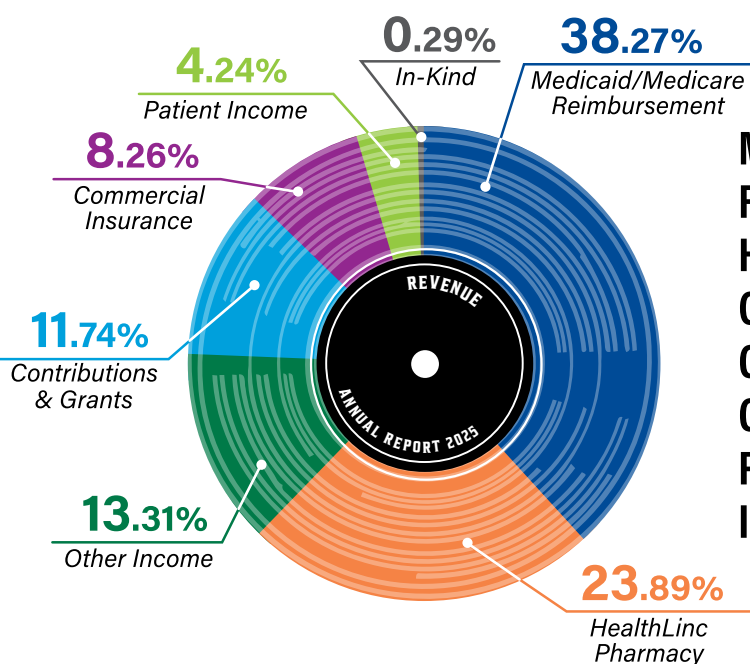

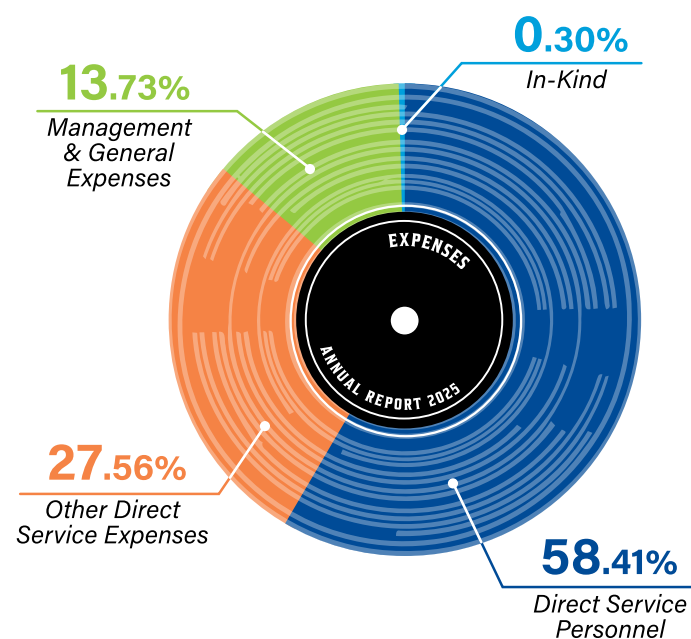
